Romans 10:9-11. We are to:

Confess with our mouths "Jesus is Lord"

Believe in our hearts that God raised him from the dead

Promise made: You will be saved

A profession of faith is a public statement about an reality

What a profession of faith doesn't do:

- Doesn't create a relationship with Jesus
- Doesn't make a relationship with Jesus stronger
- Doesn't guarantee that my life will become easier
- Doesn't signify having 'made it' as a Christian

Romans 1:1-3:20 – Summary

- Romans is a letter from Paul, to the church in Rome, where he spells out the gospel how we are to be made right with God, through faith.
- 1:18 Our big problem is that God's wrath (right anger against sin) is being revealed from heaven against ungodliness
- 2:1-5 Worse news still knowing the difference between right and wrong, doesn't make us right
- 2:17-24 Worse news again being brought up, or becoming, 'religious' doesn't help us one little bit
- 3:9-10 Summary we are all under sin, there is no one who is righteous

<u>Total Depravity</u>: Every single part of our life and world has been so impacted by sin that there is nothing worthy about us that causes God to save us, and no possible way that we can make a move towards God.

Romans 3:21-30

Verses 21 - 22:

- Righteousness –
- From God (twice) -
- Apart from the law –
- To which the law and the prophets testify –
- Through faith in Jesus to all who believe –

Three pictures of salvation:

- Justified
 - o Picture is from the law court
 - A guilty person is declared 'not guilty' by the judge
 - How is this possible for guilty people with a right judge?
- Redemption
 - o Picture is from the slave market
 - o A slave price is paid, and the slave can go free
 - Who is the slave, and what is the price paid
- Sacrifice of Atonement
 - o Picture is from the temple
 - o A sacrifice is made, so that the anger of God will be removed
 - o Is God really angry? What is the sacrifice?

Commitment #1: Jesus Christ is my Lord and Saviour

I profess that Jesus Christ is my Lord and Saviour, and I want to follow and serve him as his disciple. I believe that he is the Son of God sent to redeem the world. I love and trust him as the one who saves me from my sin; I continue to turn from my rebellion against my Lord, and embrace him as the Lord of my life with repentance and joy.

What I believe:

Jesus is the Son of God

Jesus was sent to redeem the world

He saves me from my sin

What I feel:

I love him

I trust him

I find my joy in him

What I do:

I follow and serve him as a disciple

I turn from sin and embrace him as Lord

I am ready to profess my faith when:

I know, understand and believe the gospel

I am in a living relationship with Jesus

I am growing in faith, love and obedience

Session Three

Romans 4 - Righteousness by Faith

Romans 4:3 – The way it always was

Romans 4:11-12 – The same way for the Jews (circumcised) and the rest (uncircumcised)

Romans 4:22-25 – By faith God credits to me righteousness

<u>Election</u>

- Ephesians 1:4-5
- Romans 8:30
- Canons of Dort 1. Articles 7 and 9

How the doctrine of election is used in the Bible:

- To give Christians assurance, because salvation lies with God who is faithful
- To give glory to God, because from start to finish, salvation is his work
- Never to exclude people from the gospel

• Never to insight hopelessness

How should the doctrine of election be used? How should it not be used?

What is the alternative to election?

Romans 5:1-11 - What is ours by Faith

Peace with God

- A living relationship with God
- Prayer
- Eternal hope

<u>Joy</u>

- A real lasting joy
- That even is present in suffering

<u>Hope</u>

- For eternity
- No matter what our experiences

Love

- From God that is not based on my performance / goodness
- Assured in us by the Holy Spirit

Everything that we struggle with is answered in the gospel – the peace, joy, hope and love that is ours through faith.

Commitment #2: I believe the Bible and the teachings of this church

I acknowledge that the teaching of the Old and New Testaments, summarised in the Apostle's Creed and our Confessions, and taught in this Christian church, is the true and complete doctrine of salvation.

Group Discussion:

- If we are saved by faith, does it matter if we live in obedience to God?
- Why do you think we are always tempted to place more importance on our obedience, and less on faith in Christ?

- How does understanding election make you feel? How does it give us greater assurance of faith? How does it work against our pride? Why does it mean more glory to God?
- What are some of the things that people your age struggle with? How does knowing that we have peace, joy, hope and love from God help us with these struggles?

Session Four

Commitment #3: Accepting the promises of God made at my baptism

I accept the gracious promises of God sealed to me in my baptism and affirm my union with Christ and His church which baptism signifies

Promises made to us by God at our baptism:

- We are part of his covenant family of faith and all the blessings of that
 - Hearing the gospel
 - Seeing Christian life lived out
 - People who love us and care for us
- If we repent and believe then we will be saved

Profession of faith is about accepting and receiving those promises of God as our own, and not just because we belong to a Christian family.

Profession of Faith Statement #4:

I promise to do all I can, with the help of the Holy Spirit, to strengthen my love and commitment to Christ by sharing faithfully in its means of grace, honouring and submitting to its supervision and discipline, and I join with the people of God in doing the work of the Lord wherever I am.

Sharing faithfully in its means of grace

- Means of grace the way in which God grows his people
 - Through the preaching of the Word and the sacraments
 - o Sacraments as the Word demonstrated

Preaching of the Word

- I put myself in places where I can continue to hear the Word
 - o Sunday Services
 - o Branch Youth / Home Groups
 - o 1-2-1 Bible studies
- I am committed to growing as I read, hear and study the Word putting it into practise

Sacraments

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• I participate in Lord's Supper and Baptism

How important is it to be at Sunday Services regularly?

Could you say "I read the Bible lots a home, I don't really need to go to church?"

How do participating in the sacraments help us to grow as Christians?

Honouring and Submitting to its Supervision and Discipline

- We support and respond to the work of the elders in the church
- We support the work of leaders of ministries that we are involved in

Supervision

- I prayerfully participate in the election of elders in the church
 - o Looking for men who fit the biblical criteria for eldership
- I pray for the elders of the church
- I submit to the leadership of the elders in the church

Discipline

- I watch my own life and beliefs closely
- I participate in mutual accountability within the church
- I respect the direction and discipline that comes from the elders

What should you do if you disagree with something the elders decide?

How can you help make the work of elders and leaders a joy and not a burden?

What should we do if we see another member of the church dishonouring Christ in the way they live?

Join with the people of God in doing the work of the Lord wherever I am

- We are all part of the mission of Jesus together
- Ministry is not to be done alone, or by a few, it is shared by the whole church

Serving

- I will use my God given gifts for the benefit of the church
 - o Serving wherever need arises
 - o Serving in ministries in the church

Unity

- I will help protect the unity of the church
 - Refusing to gossip or slander
 - o Sorting out differences quickly
 - Being on the lookout for those who are on the outer

Money

- I will help contribute financially to the work of the church
 - o As God enables us to do
 - o Making sure our priorities are reflected in our budget

Mission

- I will play an active part in the church's gospel work in the community and world
 - o Warmly promoting the church where I can
 - $\circ \quad \text{Praying for the work of the gospel}$
 - o Loving others and sharing my faith
