Some churches just seem to have an advantage. You visit them and they seem to have "it". You can't really put your finger on what it is, but they have it. Because they have it, people keep coming and the church is growing. They seem to know where they have come from and where they are going. They have a clear sense of direction. Decisions, both major and minor, are made with razor sharp precision. It appears that the leaders of these churches proactively

follow a well thought out roadmap as they journey into the future. Bumps along the road do not unsettle them; they just get back on track.

Then there are other churches. I've met many of them; some years ago I was called to lead one. These churches have no sense of direction. For a while they might go in one direction following one leader. But not everyone is happy in the church.

When the leader leaves the church goes in an opposite direction, hope to please another segment of the church. Most decisions are reactive. And the church actually goes nowhere, spinning its ecclesiastical wheels. Church attendance is a roller coaster, and many people drop off. People check these churches out but leave by the back door as quick as they come. Clearly these churches do not seem to have an advantage.

What's the difference? The churches with an advantage have a clear, planned, well thought out ministry strategy! They are following a ministry plan and implement change in keeping with that plan. These churches are gearing for ministry growth. The others churches are simply trying to maintain what they have.

Now these differences might not be so clear cut as I have outlined. But this is what I have observed in my years of

ministry in Canada as well as in my role with Ministry Formation in the Christian Reformed Churches of Australia (CRCA). Churches which are purpose driven for the most part have an advantage over those who are not.

There are some pastors and church leaders who just seem to know how to lead. Some have it intuitively; others have received training. But there are many ministers who need some help in developing

a clear ministry strategy for their church. They need guidance to walk a church through adaptive change. They require coaching, someone who knows a bit more than they do to assist them to lead a church through uncharted territory.

I have been coaching with Ministry Advantage since January 2008.
